CHRIS ALLER/DAC/UNIT: FORSCOM AFOP-TCO/TEL: (910)570-6325, DSN 670 GENTEXT/REMARKS/1. **PURPOSE.** FORCES COMMAND PROVIDES A BASE LINE OF INDIVIDUAL, LEADER, AND COLLECTIVE PRE-DEPLOYMENT TRAINING REGARDLESS OF COMBATANT COMMAND (CCMD) ASSIGNED OR MISSION. PRE-DEPLOYMENT TRAINING CAN BE MODIFIED PER THIS GUIDANCE ONCE THE UNIT IS ON ORDERS TO DEPLOY TO A CCMD WITH A SPECIFIC MISSION AND THE CCMD SPECIFIES WHAT TRAINING IS REQUIRED. REQUIRED TRAINING FOR SHORT DURATION DEPLOYMENTS LESS THAN 30 DAYS OR OVERSEAS DEPLOYMENT TRAINING (ODT) IS DETERMINED BY UNIT COMMANDERS (CDR), IN COORDINATION WITH THEATER SPONSOR, BASED ON MISSION ANALYSIS, TRAINING OBJECTIVES, AND THEATER CONSTRAINTS. THE FORSCOM TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOCUS IS REQUIRED TRAINING WHICH MUST BE ACCOMPLISHED PRIOR TO DEPLOYMENT. PRIOR TO DEPLOYMENT, UNLESS STATED OTHERWISE, MEANS TRAINING IS TO OCCUR WITHIN 12 MONTHS OF A LATEST ARRIVAL DATE (LAD) INTO A THEATER OF OPERATION. NOTHING IN THIS DOCUMENT RELIEVES A UNIT COMMANDER OF ULTIMATELY BEING RESPONSIBLE FOR TRAINING HIS/HER UNIT. COMMANDERS SHOULD PRIORITIZE THEIR TRAINING REQUIREMENTS BASED ON THEIR MISSION ANALYSIS AND TIME AVAILABLE TO TRAIN PRIOR TO DEPLOYMENT. ANNEX A PROVIDES DETAILED INFORMATION ON THE REQUIRED TRAINING. ANNEX B PROVIDES CDRS REQUIRED MISSION SPECIFIC TRAINING WITHIN THEIR FORMATIONS. ANNEX C THRU I PROVIDE ADDITIONAL ASCC/CCMD SPECIFIC REQUIREMENTS PROVIDED BY THE ASCC(S)/CCMD(S). THIS DOCUMENT SUPERSEDES FORSCOM RAF TRAINING REQUIREMENTS, DATED 11 FEB 14. THIS DOCUMENT INCORPORATES REQUIREMENTS AND PROCEDURES FROM DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY WITH REGARD TO RESERVE COMPONENT (RC) DEPLOYING FORCES PRE AND POST MOBILIZATION (MOB) TRAINING STRATEGY AND WILL BE USED ALONG WITH ADRP 7-0 TO GUIDE DEVELOPMENT OF THE UNIT TRAINING PLAN. COMMANDERS WILL CONDUCT A MISSION ANALYSIS OF THEIR UNIT REQUEST FOR FORCES/FORCE TRACKING NUMBER TO DETERMINE SPECIFIED AND IMPLIED TASKS; APPLY MISSION ESSENTIAL TASK LIST (METL); INCORPORATE THE RESULTS OF ANALYSIS, FORSCOM REQUIREMENTS, DOCTRINE, AND INFORMATION OBTAINED AS A RESULT OF COORDINATION AND/OR LEADERS RECON INTO THEIR MISSION AREA OF RESPONSIBILITY. UNITS DEPLOYING PRIOR TO 1 APR 15 OR RC UNITS THAT ARE ALREADY EXECUTING AN APPROVED FINAL TRAINING PLAN WILL ENDEAVOR TO ACCOMPLISH REQUIREMENTS IDENTIFIED IN THIS UPDATED GUIDANCE. ALL OTHER UNITS WILL INCORPORATE THIS DOCUMENT NLT 1 APR 15. RC UNITS WILL FOCUS PRE-MOB TRAINING RESOURCES ON REPORTING TO MOBILIZATION TRAINING CENTERS AT T-3, ENSURING UNITS ARE MANNED/EQUIPPED ADEQUATELY TO MEET AIM POINTS AND DERIVE BENEFIT FROM SCHEDULED COLLECTIVE TRAINING. RESERVE UNITS WILL ENDEAVOR TO ACCOMPLISH ADDITIONAL TRAINING REQUIREMENTS WITHIN AVAILABLE UNIT TRAINING TIME. FIRST ARMY ASSISTS ALL RC UNITS IN COMPLETION OF THEATER SPECIFIED TRAINING. FIRST ARMY WILL ENSURE ALL PROGRAMS OF INSTRUCTIONS (POI) ARE ROUTINELY REEVALUATED WITH THE MOST CURRENT LESSONS LEARNED, AFTER ACTION REVIEWS, AND TACTICS TECHNIQUES AND PROCEDURES. THIS DOCUMENT IS NOT ALL-INCLUSIVE AND CDRS AT ANY LEVEL MAY ADD ADDITIONAL TASKS TO ENSURE UNITS ARE TRAINED. THE LEVEL OF TRAINING AND TOTAL DURATION OF TRAINING MAY DIFFER BETWEEN UNITS DEPENDING ON MISSION AND LEVEL OF EXPERTISE REQUIRED. FORCES COMMAND HAS A MITIGATION PROCEDURE UNDER THE DIRECTOR OF READINESS DIVISION. THE MOBILIZATION READINESS AND MOVEMENT (MRM) SECURE VTC HOSTED BY FORSCOM WITH SUPPORTED CCMD, HQDA, FIRST ARMY, NATIONAL GUARD BUREAU, U.S. ARMY RESERVE COMMAND,

CORPS, DIVISIONS, AND MISSION SUPPORT ELEMENTS TO THE FORUM WHERE ANY UNIT UNABLE TO MEET ALL PRE-DEPLOYMENT TRAINING REQUIRED SUBMITS WHAT TASKS ARE NOT GOING TO BE ACHIEVED IN ORDER TO DEPLOY ON TIME AND REASONS CONTRIBUTING TO THE TRAINING SHORTFALL. SUPPORTED CCMD THEN DECIDES WHETHER TO ACCEPT UNIT AS IS, PROVIDE TRAINING ONCE IN THEATER, OR REQUEST UNIT DELAY DEPLOYMENT UNTIL TRAINING IS COMPLETED. UNIT RECORD KEEPING, WHICH INCLUDE AFTER ACTION REVIEWS (AAR), IS MANDATED BY ARMY REGULATION (AR) 11-33, ARMY LESSONS LEARNED PROGRAM, [HTTP://WWW.ARMY.MIL/USAPA/EPUBS/PDF/R11_33.PDF](http://www.army.mil/usapa/epubs/pdf/r11_33.pdf) WHICH REINFORCES BRIGADE-SIZED AND LARGER UNIT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO SUBMIT THEIR AAR TO TRAINING AND DOCTRINE COMMAND (TRADOC) CENTER FOR ARMY LESSONS LEARNED (CALL) AND ESTABLISHES SUBMISSION PROCEDURES. SUBMIT AAR TO THE DOD DIRECTED JOINT LESSONS LEARNED INFORMATION SYSTEM (JLLIS), [https://WWW.JLLIS.MIL](https://www.jllis.mil). SEE CALL PUBLICATION 09-22, COMMANDERS GUIDE TO OPERATIONAL RECORDS AND DATA COLLECTION HANDBOOK ([HTTPS://CALL2.ARMY.MIL/TOC.ASPX?DOCUMENT=5018](https://call2.army.mil/toc.aspx?document=5018)). 1.B(2) NON-STANDARD WEAPONS TRAINING IS AVAILABLE FOR SELECT PERSONNEL WHO WILL DEPLOY ON MISSIONS THAT REQUIRE US SOLDIERS TO TRAIN PARTNER NATIONS.

1.C. REGIONALLY ALIGNED FORCES (TRAINING).

1.C(1) REGIONALLY ALIGNED FORCES (RAF).

REGIONALLY ALIGNED FORCES INCLUDE ALL U.S. ARMY FORCES THAT ARE ASSIGNED TO COMBATANT COMMANDERS (CCDR) BY THE SECRETARY OF DEFENSE, ALLOCATED TO CCDRS THROUGH THE GLOBAL FORCE MANAGEMENT (GFM) PROCESS, OR SERVICE RETAINED - COMBATANT COMMAND ALIGNED (SRCA) BY HEADQUARTERS, DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY, AS CODIFIED IN THE FORSCOM MISSION ALIGNMENT ORDER (MAO), PUBLISHED ANNUALLY. REGIONAL ALIGNMENT PROVIDES U.S. ARMY UNITS TRAINING AND READINESS FOCUS. IN ORDER TO REMAIN GLOBALLY RESPONSIVE, RAF MAINTAIN THEIR FOCUS ON MASTERING FUNDAMENTAL STANDARD METL PROFICIENCIES THROUGHOUT THE SUSTAINABLE READINESS MODEL WHILE PREPARING TO SUPPORT CCMD REQUIREMENTS AND REGION-SPECIFIC TRAINING. TRAINING FOCUSED ON UNIFIED LAND OPERATIONS STANDARD METL PREPARES OUR FORCES TO EXCEL DURING THE SEIZE THE INITIATIVE AND DOMINATE PHASES OF AN OPERATION. THE REGIONALLY-FOCUSED TRAINING, PARTICULARLY CULTURAL, REGIONAL EXPERTISE, AND LANGUAGE (CREL) COMBINED WITH ADVISE AND ASSIST SKILLS TRAINING, PREPARES ARMY FORCES FOR THE SHAPE AND DETER PHASES OF AN OPERATION. THE SKILLS DERIVED FROM REGIONALLY-FOCUSED TRAINING ASSIST OUR CCMDs IN THEIR THEATER SECURITY COOPERATION ACTIVITIES AND ARE DESIGNED TO PREVENT CONFLICTS FROM OCCURRING. MISSION-SPECIFIC INDIVIDUAL, LEADER, AND COLLECTIVE TRAINING REQUIREMENTS FOR RAF UNITS ARE DEVELOPED BY THE CCMDs. ONCE DEVELOPED,

THESE REQUIREMENTS ARE PUBLISHED ANNUALLY IN THE FORSCOM RAF TRAINING REQUIREMENTS MESSAGE. TRAINING RAF IS AN ARMY TOTAL FORCE (ACTIVE, NATIONAL GUARD, USAR UNITS) EFFORT. COMBATANT COMMANDS PROVIDE TRAINING REQUIREMENTS THAT SHAPE UNIT TRAINING IN THE READY PHASE OF THE SUSTAINABLE READINESS MODEL FOR STANDARD METL AND REGION SPECIFIC PROFICIENCY IN ORDER TO ASSURE AGILITY, VERSATILITY AND DEPTH IN SUPPORT OF CCMD OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS. IN THE AVAILABLE YEAR, CCMDS PROVIDE EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES THAT TRAINED AND READY RAF UNITS SUPPORT TO HELP THE CCMD CDR SHAPE THE OPERATIONAL ENVIRONMENT. RAF UNITS WILL ALSO SUSTAIN STANDARD METL PROFICIENCY AND GLOBAL RESPONSIVENESS DURING THE AVAILABLE YEAR.

1.C(2) SHAPING RAF TRAINING.

COMBATANT COMMANDS INFORM THE TRAINING PROCESS BY ANNUALLY SUBMITTING RAF PRE-DEPLOYMENT TRAINING REQUIREMENTS THAT INCLUDE STANDARD METL MISSION TRAINING GUIDANCE BY UNIT TYPE, PRE-DEPLOYMENT TRAINING REQUIREMENTS, AND THEATER ENTRY REQUIREMENTS. THE MISSION TRAINING GUIDANCE BY UNIT TYPE FOR STANDARD METL ALLOWS UNIT COMMANDERS AND CULMINATING TRAINING EVENT (CTE) EXERCISE DIRECTORS TO FOCUS THE UNIT'S STANDARD METL TRAINING AND CULMINATING TRAINING EVENTS TO MEET PROJECTED THEATER REQUIREMENTS. RAF UNIT STANDARD METL CTES ARE NOT MISSION REHEARSAL EXERCISES, BUT ARE OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE UNIT TO DEMONSTRATE METL PROFICIENCY IN A REGIONALLY -INFORMED ENVIRONMENT. THE PRE-DEPLOYMENT TRAINING AND THEATER ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FEED THE REGION-SPECIFIC TRAINING THAT PREPARES THE UNIT TO DEPLOY AND EXECUTE MISSIONS IN SUPPORT OF THE CCMD. IN ORDER FOR UNITS TO BE PREPARED TO EXECUTE MISSIONS AT THE START OF THE AVAILABLE PERIOD, REGION-SPECIFIC TRAINING MUST BE INTEGRATED AND OCCUR THROUGHOUT THE READY AND OR TRANSITION PHASE, BUT ACCELERATES IN THE LAST 90 DAYS OF THE PHASE. REGION-SPECIFIC TRAINING IS A BUILDING BLOCK METHODOLOGY THAT BEGINS WITH REGION SPECIFIC SEMINARS AND CULTURAL, REGIONAL EXPERTISE, AND CREL COMPATANCY TRAINING THAT PREPARES THE UNIT TO UNDERSTAND LOCAL CULTURES AND THE OPERATIONAL ENVIRONMENT.

1.C(3) UNIFIED LAND OPERATIONS (ULO).

THE MOST SIGNIFICANT TRAINING CHALLENGE IS DEVELOPING AND MAINTAINING SKILLS THAT APPLY TO ALL POTENTIAL OPERATIONS AND DESIGNING A TRAINING PLAN THAT REFLECTS THE FLUIDITY AND COMPLEXITY OF VARIOUS MISSIONS AND ADVERSARIES. ARMY FORCES MUST BE CAPABLE OF DEFEATING A HYBRID THREAT, DEFINED AS A DIVERSE AND DYNAMIC COMBINATION OF REGULAR FORCES, IRREGULAR FORCES, CRIMINAL ELEMENTS, OR SOME COMBINATION THEREOF, UNIFIED TO ACHIEVE MUTUALLY BENEFITTING EFFECTS. TRAINING WITH OUR UNIFIED ACTION PARTNERS IS CRITICAL TO PREPARING REGIONALLY ALIGNED FORCES TO EXECUTE BOTH STANDARD METL AND THEATER SECURITY COOPERATION MISSIONS IN SUPPORT OF CCMD OBJECTIVES. BY INTEGRATING THE FOUR FOUNDATIONS OF UNIFIED LAND OPERATIONS: INITIATIVE, DECISIVE ACTION, ARMY CORE COMPETENCIES, AND MISSION COMMAND, ARMY COMMANDERS CAN ACHIEVE MISSION SUCCESS.

1.C(4) ARMY CONTINGENCY CAPABLE FORCES (ACCF)/MISSION ALIGNMENT ORDER (MAO).

THE ARMY CONTINGENCY CAPABLE FORCES (ACCF) CONSISTS OF TWO ELEMENTS, THE JOINT CONTINGENCY FORCE PACKAGE (JCFP) AND THE ARMY CONTINGENCY FORCE PACKAGE (ACFP). THE ACFP PROVIDES THE ARMY STRATEGIC FLEXIBILITY TO RESPOND TO EMERGING AND CONTINGENCY REQUIREMENTS. UTILIZATION OF ACCF IS BASED ON CCMD SPECIFIED FORCE REQUIREMENTS AND RESPONSE TIMELINES AT TIME OF INCIDENT. THE FORSCOM MAO IDENTIFIES THE UNITS ALIGNED TO ACFP REQUIREMENTS. ACFP FORCES WILL BE RESOURCED TO ACHIEVE SPECIFIED TRAINING READINESS LEVELS (AC T-1/2; RC T-2/3) AS SET IN THE FORSCOM COMMAND TRAINING GUIDANCE. THE ACFP IS NOT ALIGNED AGAINST A

SPECIFIC CCMD REQUIREMENT AND THEREFORE TRAINS TO STANDARD UNIT MISSION ESSENTIAL TASK LIST (METL).

1.C(5) RAF TRAINING AND EMPLOYMENT BY PHASE (PREPARE, READY AND OR TRANSITION, MISSION OR COMMITTED).

THE FORSCOM RAF PRE-DEPLOYMENT TRAINING REQUIREMENTS INCLUDE DETAILED INFORMATION ON THE REQUIRED TRAINING TASKS DESCRIBED IN THE BASE DOCUMENT AND ITS ANNEXES. ANNEX A IS FOCUSED TO A UNITS BASE LINE TRAINING FOR DEPLOYMENTS AS WELL AS HQDA APPROVED STANDARDIZED METL. ANNEX B PROVIDES COMMANDERS THE REQUIRED ADDITIONAL MISSION-SPECIFIC PRE-DEPLOYMENT TRAINING FOR SPECIALIZED UNITS OR INDIVIDUALS WITHIN THEIR FORMATIONS. ANNEXES C THRU I PROVIDE ADDITIONAL SPECIFIC CCMD TRAINING GUIDANCE FOR THEIR RESPECTIVE AREAS OF OPERATIONS.

1.C(5) (A) PREPARE PHASE.

PRIOR TO ENTERING THE PREPARE PERIOD; UNITS WILL RECEIVE A MAO DETAILING MISSION AND TRAINING FOCUS. UPON RECEIPT OF UNIT RAF ASSIGNMENT, COMMANDERS WILL REVIEW THE RAF TRAINING REQUIREMENTS TO IDENTIFY TRAINING FOR INCLUSION IN THEIR UNIT TRAINING PLANS. THE CCMD CAN PROVIDE ADDITIONAL GUIDANCE FOR REGIONAL TRAINING REQUIREMENTS TO THE SENIOR OPERATIONAL COMMANDER IN ORDER TO INFLUENCE TRAINING FOR THE RAF.

1.C(5) (B) READY AND OR TRANSITION PHASE.

IN THE READY AND OR TRANSITION PHASE OF THE SUSTAINABLE READINESS MODEL, UNITS FOCUS ON ACHIEVING STANDARD METL PROFICIENCY WHILE INCORPORATING REGION-SPECIFIC TRAINING THROUGHOUT THE YEAR. UNITS FOCUS ON INDIVIDUAL, COLLECTIVE, AND LEADER TASKS REQUIRED TO ACHIEVE HQDA APPROVED STANDARDIZED METL PROFICIENCY: GUNNERY, PLT/CO LFX/STX, BN FTX, CULMINATING TRAINING EVENT. REGIONAL-FOCUSED TRAINING TASKS ARE INTEGRATED WHERE APPROPRIATE THROUGHOUT THE TRAINING CYCLE BUT TRAINING FOCUS SHIFTS FROM STANDARD METL TO REGIONAL TRAINING AFTER THE UNIT CTE.

1.C(5) (C) MISSION OR COMMITTED PHASE.

IN THE MISSION OR COMMITTED PERIOD OF THE SUSTAINABLE READINESS MODEL, UNITS SUSTAIN STANDARD METL TRAINING WHILE CONTINUING TO FOCUS ON REGION SPECIFIC TRAINING TO MEET CCMD REQUIREMENTS. RAF UNITS MAINTAIN HQDA APPROVED STANDARDIZED METL PROFICIENCY BY CONDUCTING SUSTAINMENT TRAINING THROUGHOUT THE YEAR. DUE TO THE REQUIREMENT FOR WORLDWIDE DEPLOYMENT AVAILABILITY, THE RAF MUST BE ACTIVELY MANAGED FOR EMPLOYMENT OF ITS FORCES IN SUPPORT OF THE CCMD TO ENSURE THAT IT REMAINS CAPABLE OF DEPLOYMENT. RESOURCE AVAILABILITY AND OTHER CONSTRAINTS WILL AFFECT UNIT TRAINING PROFICIENCY LEVELS FOR BOTH STANDARD METL AND REGIONAL ALIGNED TRAINING. COMMANDERS WILL CONSULT THE APPLICABLE FORSCOM COMMAND TRAINING GUIDANCE AND FORSCOM SUPPLEMENTAL TRAINING GUIDANCE TO DETERMINE APPROPRIATE PRIORITIES AND READINESS LEVELS.

1.D. INDIVIDUAL REPLACEMENT DEPLOYMENT OPERATIONS (IRDO).

ACTIVE UNITS AND FIRST ARMY (FOR RC UNITS ATTACHED TO FIRST ARMY FOR MOBILIZATION/DEPLOYMENT) ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR EXECUTING TRAINING TO ENSURE ALL SOLDIERS ARE TRAINED IN INDIVIDUAL PRE-DEPLOYMENT TASKS AND ARMY WARRIOR BATTLE DRILLS. IRDO PROGRAMS WILL INCORPORATE AT A MINIMUM ALL REQUIRED INDIVIDUAL TRAINING TASKS. NON-UNIT REPLACEMENT PERSONNEL (NRP) WILL CONTINUE TO TRAIN AT THE CONUS REPLACEMENT CENTER(CRC) FT BLISS, TX.

1.E. TRADOC INSTITUTIONAL TRAINING AND EDUCATION COURSES.

THE ARMY PLANS AND PROGRAMS INSTITUTIONAL TRAINING REQUIREMENTS (QUOTAS /SEATS) THROUGH THE STRUCTURE MANNING DECISION REVIEW (SMDR). WITH THE POSSIBLE ELIMINATION OF OCO FUNDING, USING THE SMDR PROCESS TO PROGRAM TRAINING REQUIREMENTS AND RESOURCES BECOMES INCREASINGLY IMPORTANT, ESPECIALLY IF THE PRE-DEPLOYMENT COURSE WILL BECOME AN ENDURING

REQUIREMENT. QUOTAS (SEATS) FOR SPECIFIC DEPLOYING UNITS ARE PRIMARILY ATTAINED DURING THE ARMY SYNCHRONIZATION AND RESOURCING CONFERENCE (ASRC) DURING THE INSTITUTIONAL TRAINING WORK GROUP (ITWG). IF QUOTAS WERE NOT GAINED DURING THE ITWG, DEPLOYING UNITS ARE REQUIRED TO REQUEST SEATS THROUGH HQ FORSCOM LEADERSHIP DIVISION. DEPLOYING UNITS WILL NOT GO DIRECTLY TO THE TRADOC SCHOOL TO ATTAIN TRAINING QUOTAS/SEATS.

UNITS PROJECTING ARRIVAL AT THE MTC BELOW THESE LEVELS WILL INFORM FIRST ARMY NOT LATER THAN THE JOINT ASSESSMENT.

ENVIRONMENT AND MUST BE INCORPORATED INTO ALL TRAINING EVENTS AND THEATER REPLICATED ENVIRONMENTS AT HOME STATION AND COMBAT TRAINING CENTERS (CTC), MOBILIZATION FORCE GENERATION INSTALLATIONS (MFGI) OR MOBILIZATION TRAINING CENTERS (MTC). COMMANDERS MUST TRAIN THEIR UNITS AND ACHIEVE READINESS THROUGH THE FORCE GENERATION MODEL. REGARDLESS OF MISSION, COMMANDERS WILL CONDUCT C-IED TRAINING AT HOME STATION. C-IED TRAINING WILL NO LONGER BE AVAILABLE AT THE CTCS AS PART OF PRE-ROTATIONAL OR RSOI TRAINING. FIRST ARMY MTCS PROVIDE C-IED MOBILIZATION READINESS AND VALIDATION TRAINING. RC UNITS SHOULD COORDINATE WITH FIRST ARMY CI2C UPON RECEIPT OF MISSION ORDER TO PLAN FOR C-IED TRAINING RESOURCES. THE FOLLOWING PROVIDES DETAILED INFORMATION ON THE REQUIRED C-IED TRAINING TASKS DESCRIBED IN THE BASE DOCUMENT. CI2C SITES WILL ASSIST UNITS TO INTEGRATE AND COORDINATE C-IED TRAINING RESOURCES.

ASAT TEACHES SOLDIERS TO BE SKILLED OBSERVERS OF THEIR SURROUNDINGS; HOW TO BE PROACTIVE, RATHER THAN REACTIVE, TO POTENTIAL THREATS; AND THE EFFICIENT USE OF OPTICS TO IMPROVE SITUATIONAL AWARENESS AND THREAT ASSESSMENT. ASAT BASIC (ASA-B) COURSE IS REQUIRED FOR DEPLOYING UNITS THAT WILL PARTNER WITH FOREIGN SECURITY FORCES. THE PRIORITY FOR ASAT TRAINING IS TO SECURITY FORCES ASSISTANCE TEAMS (SFATS), SECURITY FORCE ASSISTANCE BRIGADES (SFABS), COUNTER-INSURGENCY BATTLE SPACE OWNING BRIGADE COMBAT TEAMS, OTHER PARTNERED UNITS, GLOBAL RESPONSE FORCE (GRF), AND THEN COMBAT TRAINING CENTERS (JRTC/NTC/JMRC OPERATIONS GROUPS). 4.C(1) CONDUCT OPERATIONS TO DEFEAT THE IED SYSTEM THROUGH IDENTIFICATION, THEN ATTACKING THESE SYSTEMS. CRITICAL ELEMENTS INCLUDE: PREDICT, PREVENT, DETECT, NEUTRALIZE, AND MITIGATE EFFECTS.

4.C(2) ESTABLISH A C-IED TASK FORCE, CELL, OR BOARD IN EVERY HQ TO ADAPT TO C-IED TTPS IN A TIME-SENSITIVE MANNER AS ENEMY TTPS ALSO CHANGE.

4.C(3) PREPARE REQUEST FOR INTELLIGENCE, SURVEILLANCE, AND RECONNAISSANCE IN SUPPORT OF COUNTER IMPROVISED EXPLOSIVE DEVICE OPERATIONS (TASK 301-192-6003).

4.C(4) INTEGRATE IMPROVISED EXPLOSIVE DEFEAT THE DEVICE (DTD) ENABLERS INTO UNIT OPERATIONS. STAFF TASKS INCLUDE DIRECTING OR TASKING EXPLOSIVE ORDNANCE DISPOSAL (EOD) UNITS, EXPEDITIONARY FORENSIC LABORATORIES (EFL), COMBINED EXPLOSIVE EXPLOITATION CELLS (CEXC), WEAPONS INTELLIGENCE TEAMS (WIT), ELECTRONIC WARFARE OFFICER ELECTRONIC COUNTER MEASURES (EWO-ECM), AND ENGINEER COMPANIES SOURCED FOR ROUTE CLEARANCE OPERATIONS. 4.D. C-IED COLLECTIVE TRAINING.

REQUIRED C-IED COLLECTIVE TRAINING FOR CONTINGENCY/FORWARD OPERATING UNITS WITH AN AREA OF OPERATION OR THAT OPERATE CONSISTENTLY IN A NON-SECURE AREA. TRAINING TASKS ARE IN ADDITION TO REQUIREMENTS OF THOSE C-IED TRAINING FOR SECURE AREA OF OPERATION.

4.D(1) CONDUCT LIVE FIRE EXERCISES. UNITS WILL CONDUCT COLLECTIVE LIVE-FIRE EXERCISES (LFX) INCORPORATING THE IED BATTLEFIELD CONDITION. IAW APPROPRIATE FIELD MANUALS, LFX SCENARIOS SHOULD BE DESIGNED BASED ON UNIT MISSION, METL, AND MEEL. UNITS COLLECTIVE LFX WILL INCORPORATE CONDITIONS AND SITUATIONS THAT THEY ARE EXPECTED TO FACE IN THEATER SUCH AS IED CONTACT, AMBUSHES, SNIPER, URBAN CONDITIONS, AND CIVILIAN CASUALTIES (CIVCAS). QUALIFICATION AND LIVE-FIRE EXERCISES WILL BE CONDUCTED UP TO THE LEVEL THE UNIT IS EXPECTED TO BE EMPLOYED IN THEATER.

4.D(2) COMPLETE C-IED COLLECTIVE TASKS AND DRILLS. ALL UNITS MUST COMPLETE THE FOLLOWING C-IED TASKS.

4.D(2)(A) REACT TO A POSSIBLE IMPROVISED EXPLOSIVE DEVICE (IED), VEHICLE BORNE IED (VBIED), SUICIDE VBIED OR PERSON BORNE IED (TASK 05-3-3091).

4.D(2)(B) PREPARE FOR A SUSPECTED VEHICLE-BORNE IMPROVISED EXPLOSIVE DEVICE (VBIED)/PERSON-BORNE IED (PBIED) ATTACK AGAINST A STATIC POSITION (TASK 05-2-3092).

4.D(2)(C) PLAN FOR COUNTER-IED (C-IED) OPERATIONS (TASK 05-6-1006).

4.D(2)(D) REACT TO AN IED ATTACK WHILE MOUNTED(05-3-D0017).

4.D(2)(E) CONDUCT THE FIVE-C(S) (05-03-D0016).

4.D(2)(F) REACT TO AN IED ATTACK WHILE DISMOUNTED (05-3-D0015).

4.D(2)(G) CONDUCT 5/25/200 METER CHECKS (05-3-D0019).

4.D(2)(H) MANAGE CREW SYSTEMS (TASK 301-230-6002). UNITS MUST CONDUCT TRAINING BY UTILIZING UNIT EW PERSONNEL, ASSISTED AND FACILITATED BY THE CI2C.

4.D(2)(I) C-IED BRIEFINGS/SEMINARS/TRAINING. COMMANDERS WILL INTEGRATE C-IED TASKS, TRAINING, AND ENABLERS INTO ALL OPERATIONS. COMMANDERS MUST ENSURE C-IED TRAINING IS CONDUCTED AN INDIVIDUAL, SQUAD, PLT, CO, AND BN/BDE MISSION COMMAND LEVELS.

4.D(2)(J) THE ASYMMETRIC WARFARE GROUP (AWG) UNIT SUPPORT CAPABILITY PROVIDES SEMINARS TO BRIGADE COMBAT TEAMS. THERE ARE AWG BATTLE STAFF SEMINARS FOR BDE STAFFS AND BDE CDR/CSM TRAINING SEMINARS.

4.D(2)(K) THE ASYMMETRIC WARFARE GROUP (AWG) UNIT SUPPORT CAPABILITY PROVIDES SEMINARS TO BRIGADE COMBAT TEAMS. THERE ARE AWG BATTLE STAFF SEMINARS FOR BDE STAFFS AND BDE CDR/CSM TRAINING SEMINARS.

4.E. COMPANY INTELLIGENCE SUPPORT TEAM (COIST).

4.E(1) THE COIST IS AN INTEGRAL PART OF THE COMPANY COMMAND POST DURING ALL PHASES OF AN OPERATION PROVIDING INTELLIGENCE SUPPORT TO THE COMMON OPERATING PICTURE (COP), COMMON INTELLIGENCE PICTURE (CIP), SITUATIONAL AWARENESS (SA), LIMITED LETHAL AND NONLETHAL TARGETING SUPPORT, ATTACK THE NETWORK (ATN), AND KNOWLEDGE MANAGEMENT TASKS/MISSIONS. UNITS WITH A MTOE AUTHORIZATION ARE REQUIRED TO HAVE A DESIGNATED AND TRAINED COIST AT THE COMPANY LEVEL PRIOR TO A CTC ROTATION AND DEPLOYMENT TO SUPPORT INTELLIGENCE OPERATIONS AT THE COMPANY LEVEL. IT IS HIGHLY RECOMMENDED FOR ALL OTHER UNITS DEPLOYING TO AN OPERATIONAL ENVIRONMENT THAT WOULD REQUIRE AN ORGANIC INTELLIGENCE CAPABILITY AT THE COMPANY LEVEL.

4.E(2) COMMANDERS SHOULD IDENTIFY 4-6 NON-MILITARY INTELLIGENCE (NON-MI) MOS SOLDIERS AT THE COMPANY LEVEL EARLY IN THE SRM CYCLE. SOLDIERS SERVING ON A COIST MUST BE ABLE TO OBTAIN A SECRET CLEARANCE. IT IS RECOMMENDED TO INITIATE THIS PROCESS AS SOON AS POSSIBLE.

4.E(3) FORSCOM HAS DESIGNATED THE CI2C AT EACH INSTALLATION AS THE FORSCOM PROVIDER FOR ALL COIST TRAINING AND TRAINING PLANNING SUPPORT. THE CI2C PROVIDES A LEADER BRIEF TO FAMILIARIZE COMMANDERS AND STAFF ON COIST MANNING, OPERATIONS AND FUNCTIONS. THE COMPLETE COIST TRAINING COURSE CONSISTS OF 40 HOURS, BROKEN DOWN INTO ELEVEN MODULES, DESIGNED TO TRAIN THE TEAM ON THE INTELLIGENCE CYCLE, INTELLIGENCE PREPARATION OF THE BATTLEFIELD (IPB), ANALYSIS FUNDAMENTALS, ANALYSIS PRODUCTS, INFORMATION REQUIREMENTS, INFORMATION COLLECTION MANAGEMENT, SITE EXPLOITATION INTEGRATION, AND TACTICAL QUESTIONING. ALL COIST INDIVIDUAL, SUSTAINMENT AND COLLECTIVE TRAINING CAN BE PROVIDED USING ANALOG MEANS AND IS LOCATION DEPENDENT WHERE ASSETS ARE AVAILABLE, BY DIGITAL MEANS, USING TACTICAL GROUND REPORTING SYSTEM (TIGR), JOINT CAPABILITIES RELEASE (JCR), AND APPLICABLE ANALYTICAL SYSTEMS.

4.E(4) TIGR, AND JCR TRAINING IS RECOMMENDED BUT NOT REQUIRED BEFORE ATTENDING THE 40 HOUR BLOCK OF INSTRUCTION. CONTACT CI2C FOR ASSISTANCE WITH COORDINATION FOR THIS TRAINING AT EACH INSTALLATION.

4.G. **CLOSE ACCESS TARGET RECONNAISSANCE TRAINING (CATR)**. CATR IS A PROGRAM THAT PROVIDES EDUCATION, TRAINING, EQUIPMENT FIELDING AND SUSTAINMENT ON TECHNICAL RECONNAISSANCE, SURVEILLANCE AND INFORMATION COLLECTION CAPABILITIES WHICH CAN SUPPORT FORCE PROTECTION REQUIREMENTS AND AUGMENT EXISTING ALL-SOURCE INFORMATION ANALYSIS AND TARGETING PROGRAMS FOR DEPLOYING FORCES.

IN ADDITION TO SUPPORTING C-IED CORE FUNCTIONS THROUGH ATTACK THE NETWORK, CATR ELEMENTS WILL BE TRAINED AND READY FROM SHAPE (PHASE 0) TO ENABLE CIVIL AUTHORITY (PHASE V) INCLUDING COMBINED ARMS MANEUVER OR WIDE AREA SECURITY OPERATIONS THAT REQUIRE TECHNICAL APPLICATIONS TO ENHANCE INFORMATION GATHERING CAPABILITIES FOR OPERATIONS SUCH AS HIGH VALUE TARGETS, (HVT) ASSET VALIDATION AND VETTING, STABILITY OPERATIONS, PERSONAL RECOVERY, FRIENDLY FORCE TRACKING, ENHANCED FORCE PROTECTION OR AS A MONITORING METRIC FOR RETROGRADE OPERATIONS OF LARGE OR SENSITIVE EQUIPMENT.

4.F(2) CATR PROGRAM INITIAL NEW EQUIPMENT TRAINING (NET) CONSISTS OF 20 TRAINING DAYS. THIS TRAINING IS TO PROVIDE UNITS WITH CATR TRAINED PERSONNEL ISO TECHNICAL SURVEILLANCE AND RECONNAISSANCE MISSIONS BY UTILIZING CATR PROGRAM EQUIPMENT AND TACTICS, TECHNIQUES AND PROCEDURES. THIS TRAINING IS NOT ALL INCLUSIVE AND IS TO PREPARE UNITS TO BEGIN THEIR UNIT LEVEL FORSCOM 350-1 SUSTAINMENT TRAINING FOR CATR DESIGNATED PERSONNEL. THIS TRAINING SHOULD INCLUDE A ONE DAY CATR STAFF BRIEF FOR COMMANDERS. CATR PROGRAM TRAINING ALSO INCLUDES A SEPARATE THREE DAY STAFF ORIENTATION TRAINING THAT IS CONDUCTED CONCURRENTLY WITH CATR EQUIPMENT TRAINING. FOR A BREAKDOWN OF SUBJECT MATTER, CONTACT UNIT FIELD SERVICE REPRESENTATIVE LISTED BELOW.

9.A(2) CONTINGENCY CONTRACT UNIT TRAINING (C2UT) PROVIDES THE WARFIGHTER THE FACE-TO-FACE TRAINING NECESSARY TO CONDUCT CONTRACT OVERSIGHT. THE TAILORABLE 2-4 DAY COURSES OF INSTRUCTION COVERS THE CONTRACT PROCESS FROM REQUIREMENTS DEVELOPMENT, THROUGH PERFORMANCE TO FINAL PAYMENT AND CLOSEOUT. THE OUTCOME OF C2UT IS PERSONNEL TRAINED TO DEVELOP CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS AND PERFORM AS FIELD ORDERING OFFICERS, CONTRACT OFFICER'S REPRESENTATIVES, AND PROGRAM PURCHASE OFFICERS. UNITS CAN SCHEDULE TRAINING BY CONTACTING THEIR ALIGNED CONTINGENCY CONTRACTING TEAM LOCATED AT THE INSTALLATION CONTRACTING OFFICE OR RAYMOND STROTHER, FORSCOM CONTRACT SUPPORT ELEMENT (CSE) AT COMMERCIAL (910) 570-6970; DSN (670); RAYMOND.E.STROTHER.CIV@MAIL.MIL.

9.A(3) COMMANDERS EMERGENCY RESPONSE PROGRAM (CERP). CERP IS A CONGRESSIONALLY-AUTHORIZED PROGRAM THAT ENABLES MILITARY COMMANDERS IN CONTINGENCY OPERATIONS TO RESPOND TO URGENT HUMANITARIAN RELIEF AND RECONSTRUCTION REQUIREMENTS BY EXECUTING PROJECTS THAT QUICKLY ASSIST THE LOCAL POPULATION. CERP IS A PROGRAM IMPLEMENTED BY COMMANDERS AND IS EXEMPT FROM THE FAR AND ITS SUPPLEMENTS. CERP IS EXECUTED UNDER THE POLICIES OUTLINED BY THE DOD FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT REGULATION, VOLUME 12, CHAPTER 27.

9.A(4) FIELD ORDERING OFFICERS (FOO). THE SUPPORTING CONTRACTING OFFICER APPOINTS A FIELD ORDERING OFFICER IN ACCORDANCE WITH AFARS 5153.9002. THIS APPOINTMENT DELEGATES THE CONTRACTING OFFICER'S AUTHORITY TO OBLIGATE THE GOVERNMENT FOR MICRO-PURCHASES (CHECK WITH YOUR SUPPORTING CONTRACTING OFFICER FOR CURRENT PURCHASE THRESHOLDS) FOR SUPPLIES AND LIMITED SERVICES. THIS APPOINTMENT ALSO EASES THE ADMINISTRATIVE BURDEN ON A UNIT AND ITS SUPPORTING CONTRACTING OFFICE (AND VENDORS) BY ELIMINATING LENGTHY CONTRACTING PROCEDURES FOR SMALL PURCHASES.

9.A(5) PAYING AGENT (FORMERLY KNOWN AS CLASS A AGENT). PAYING AGENTS MAKE SPECIFIC PAYMENTS. THE DISBURSING OFFICER WITHIN A SUPPORTING FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT (FM) UNIT APPOINTS SOLDIERS TO THE POSITION OF PAYING AGENT. EACH PAYING AGENT IS UNDER THE EXCLUSIVE SUPERVISION OF THE DISBURSING OFFICER IN ALL MATTERS CONCERNING CUSTODY AND DISPOSITION OF FUNDS ADVANCED TO THE PAYING AGENT. THE PAYING AGENT WILL COMPLY WITH ALL INSTRUCTIONS AND REGULATIONS THE DISBURSING OFFICER ISSUES PERTAINING TO PAYING AGENT DUTIES.

9.B. COMMANDERS OF ARMY, ARMY RESERVE, AND ARMY NATIONAL GUARD BRIGADE AND BELOW UNITS DEPLOYING IN SUPPORT OF CONTINGENCY OPERATIONS OR DEPLOYMENT OPERATIONS MUST IDENTIFY IN-THEATER REQUIREMENTS FOR COR, FOO, PAY AGENT AND CERP PERSONNEL AND MUST ENSURE TRAINING IS CONDUCTED PRIOR TO DEPLOYMENT.

9.C. TRAINING COR, FOO, CERP AND PAYING AGENTS.

9.C(1) IDENTIFY MANNING REQUIREMENTS:

9.C(1) (A) COMMANDERS MUST DETERMINE THE NUMBER OF TRAINED PERSONNEL REQUIRED TO MEET THEATER CONTRACTING REQUIREMENTS NLT LAD-180. THE REQUIRED NUMBERS OF TRAINED PERSONNEL WILL BE METT-T DEPENDANT. AS PART OF PLANNING FOR DEPLOYMENT, COMMANDERS DETERMINE THEIR COR, FOO, PAY AGENT AND CERP MANNING REQUIREMENTS BY EXAMINING THE BATTLE SPACE AND DETERMINING THOSE FUNCTIONS THAT CANNOT OR WILL NOT BE PERFORMED BY ASSIGNED PERSONNEL. IF THE DEPLOYING UNIT IS REPLACING A UNIT CURRENTLY IN THEATER, THE UNIT BEING REPLACED CAN ASSIST IN DETERMINING THE PERSONNEL REQUIREMENTS REQUIRED FOR OCS. CONTINGENCY CONTRACTING BRIGADES, BATTALIONS AND TEAMS CAN ALSO BE UTILIZED TO ASSIST THE COMMANDER DETERMINE THE NUMBERS OF PERSONNEL REQUIRED TO BE TRAINED.

9.C(2) NOMINATE PERSONNEL.

9.C(2) (A) ALL PERSONNEL NOMINATED AS COR, FOO, PAY AGENTS OR DESIGNATED AS CERP KEY PERSONNEL ARE TRAINED ON THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES PRIOR TO DEPLOYMENT BY A CONTINGENCY CONTRACTING TEAM ASSIGNED TO THE ARMY CONTRACTING COMMAND.

9.C(2) (B) COMMANDERS MUST ENSURE NOMINATED PERSONNEL POSSESS THE APPROPRIATE SKILLS AND EXPERIENCE TO PERFORM IN THE ASSIGNED FUNCTION BASED ON COMPLEXITY, THE NATURE OF THE SERVICES PERFORMED, AND THE REQUIRED LEVEL OF RESPONSIBILITY. CONTRACTING OFFICERS IN THEATER CAN DENY APPOINTMENT OF TRAINED PERSONNEL IF THEY LACK REQUIRED SKILLS. THE CONTRACTING OFFICER MAY REQUIRE PERSONNEL TO RECEIVE ADDITIONAL TRAINING PRIOR TO APPOINTMENT.

9.D. TRAIN PERSONNEL.

9.D(1) NLT LAD-90, COMMANDERS MUST ENSURE NOMINATED PERSONNEL COMPLETE ONLINE COURSES REQUIRED BY THE ARMY. REQUIRED ON-LINE COURSES INCLUDE FOUR COURSES FROM THE DEFENSE ACQUISITION UNIVERSITY: CLC 106, CLC 206, CLC 222, CLM 003 AND THE US ARMY COMBATING TRAFFICKING IN PERSONS ONLINE TRAINING. THE COR COURSE (COR 222) OFFERED THROUGH THE ARMY LOGISTICS UNIVERSITY CAN BE SUBSTITUTED FOR CLC 222. 9.D(2) FOLLOWING COMPLETION OF THE ON-LINE COURSES, INDIVIDUALS THAT MAY BE ASSIGNED COR, FOO, OR PURCHASING OFFICER DUTIES WILL RECEIVE FACE-TO-FACE CONTINGENCY CONTRACTING UNIT TRAINING (C2UT) AT HOME STATION PROVIDED BY EXPERIENCED CONTRACTING OFFICERS ASSIGNED TO THE ARMY CONTRACTING COMMAND.

9.E. REPORT TRAINING OF COR, FOO, AND CERP PERSONNEL.

CONTRACT SUPPORT ELEMENT REPORT COMMANDERS WILL PROVIDE A STATEMENT ON UNIT STATUS REPORT INDICATING THE NUMBER OF TRAINED PERSONNEL.

9.F. TRAINING OPERATIONAL CONTRACT PLANNERS.

COMMANDERS MUST APPOINT A MINIMUM OF TWO (2) PERSONNEL TO ATTEND THE OPERATIONAL CONTRACT SUPPORT COURSE (OCSC) (9E-SI3C/ASI3C/950-ASI3C), ATRRS SCHOOL CODE 907. THIS IS A 2-WEEK RESIDENT COURSE OR CAN BE PROVIDED BY A MOBILE TRAINING TEAM (MTT). WHETHER TRAINING FOR RAF OR AS A CONTINGENCY FORCE, COMMANDERS MUST IDENTIFY C-IED ENABLERS AS PART OF THE PRE-DEPLOYMENT TRAINING PLAN PROCESS AND ENSURE THEY RECEIVE THE NECESSARY INDIVIDUAL AND UNIT-LEVEL TRAINING REQUIRED TO BUILD A FULL SPECTRUM CAPABILITY TO SUPPORT ALL STAGES OF A UNIT'S PREPARATION FOR EMPLOYMENT/DEPLOYMENT. THE USARPAC ASIA PACIFIC COUNTER IED FUSION CENTER (APCFC) IS A CRITICAL RESOURCE AVAILABLE

TO COMMANDERS TO MAXIMIZE TRAINING VALUE. THE APCFC PROVIDES POLICY AND MANAGEMENT OVERSIGHT IN ALL EFFORTS TO IMPLEMENT USARPAC C-IED STRATEGY, COORDINATING, AND IMPLEMENTING MATERIAL AND NON-MATERIAL C-IED SOLUTIONS AND INITIATIVES IN SUPPORT OF CURRENT ARMY OPERATIONS. THE (APCFC) IRREGULAR WARFARE ANALYSIS CENTER (IRWAC) CONDUCTS INTELLIGENCE COLLECTION AND NETWORK ANALYSIS THAT LEADS TO THE DISRUPTION, COUNTERING OR CAPTURE OF ADVERSARIES AND THEIR IED FACILITATION NETWORKS. THIS REQUIRES SENIOR COMMANDERS TO REVIEW AND APPROVE SUBORDINATE UNIT TASK LISTS AND ENSURE THAT MISSIONS ARE SPECIFICALLY TIED TO OUR THEATER SHAPING EFFORTS AND NUMBER CONPLANS AND OPLANS. THE APCFC TRAINING FACILITATION SECTION PROVIDES COMMANDERS WITH DOCTRINALLY CORRECT AND REGIONALLY FOCUSED PROGRAM OF INSTRUCTIONS (POIS), TRAIN THE TRAINER (T3) TEAMS, AND REALISTIC COUNTRY RELATED TRAINING DEVICES.

2.A. THE USARPAC C-IED TRAINING PROGRAM IS STANDARDIZED AND CONSISTENT WITH THE ARMY AND ALL PROPONENT C-IED COURSES. COMMANDERS MUST ENSURE THEIR SOLDIERS ARE TRAINED AT HOME STATION AND ARE PREPARED TO MEET THE IED THREAT WITHIN ANY OPERATING ENVIRONMENT, REGARDLESS OF FORCE POOL DESIGNATION. COMMANDERS MUST TRAIN THEIR UNITS AND ACHIEVE READINESS THROUGH THE FORCE GENERATION MODEL. REGARDLESS OF MISSION, COMMANDERS WILL CONDUCT C-IED TRAINING AT HOME STATION. C-IED TRAINING WILL NO LONGER BE AVAILABLE AT THE COMBAT TRAINING CENTERS (CTCS) AS PART OF PRE-ROTATIONAL OR RECEPTION, STAGING, ONWARD MOVEMENT, AND INTEGRATION, (RSOI) TRAINING.

2.B. UNIT C-IED TRAINING WILL ENSURE THAT SOLDIERS, LEADERS, AND UNITS ACHIEVE AND MAINTAIN PROFICIENCY WHILE CONDUCTING OPERATIONS IN AN IED ENVIRONMENT. INDIVIDUAL SOLDIERS, LEADERS AND UNITS WILL ACHIEVE AND MAINTAIN THE STANDARDS FOR C-IED TASKS DESCRIBED IN AR'S, DRILLS, AND STP'S.

2.B(1) C-IED TASKS WILL BE INTEGRATED INTO UNIT MISSION TRAINING THROUGH THE FOLLOWING ACTIONS:

2.B(1) (A) COMMANDERS WILL ANALYZE THEIR MISSIONS AND TRAINING TO ACCOMPLISH THEM AGAINST THE IED THREAT THEY EXPECT TO FACE.

2.B(1) (B) SELECTED FIELD TRAINING EXERCISES (FTXS) AND COMMAND POST EXERCISES (CPXS) WILL INCLUDE C-IED OPERATIONS AGAINST AN OPPOSING FORCE (OPFOR) WITH THE CAPABILITY OF EMPLOYING IEDS.

2.B(1) (C) TRAINING ASSESSMENTS OF OVERALL UNIT PROFICIENCY DURING HOME STATION AND CTC EXPERIENCES, MUST IN PART, MEASURE HOW WELL THE UNIT PERFORMS IN AN IED THREAT ENVIRONMENT.

2.C UNIT C-IED TRAINING WILL INCLUDE TRAINING SELECTED UNIT PERSONNEL IN BIOMETRICS, CREW, HAND HELD DETECTORS, ROBOTICS, ETC.

2.D. UNIT C-IED TRAINING WILL INCLUDE EVERY ASPECT OF OPERATING IN AN IED THREAT ENVIRONMENT.

2.E. THE C-IED TRAINING TASK STANDARDS ARE PUBLISHED IN SOLDIER'S MANUALS, STPS, COMBINED ARMS TRAINING STRATEGIES (CATS), AND OTHER TRAINING PLANS.

2.F. THE C-IED TRAINING MUST BE FULLY INTEGRATED INTO UNIT EXERCISES (MANEUVER, FUNCTIONAL, MULTI-FUNCTIONAL AND COMMAND AND MISSION COMMAND) FOR BOTH OFFENSIVE AND DEFENSIVE OPERATIONS. REALISTIC TRAINING REQUIRES THAT ENEMY DOCTRINE AND CAPABILITIES FOR THE EMPLOYMENT OF IEDS BE UNDERSTOOD AND USED TO ENHANCE MISSION PERFORMANCE IN AN IED THREAT ENVIRONMENT.

2.G. C-IED OPERATIONS WILL BE FULLY INTEGRATED INTO EXERCISE SITUATIONS. THIS INTEGRATION WILL DEVELOP AND TEST THE CAPABILITY OF COMMANDERS, STAFFS, AND UNITS TO PERFORM THEIR MISSIONS UNDER EXPECTED IED THREAT CONDITIONS. A UNIT'S C-IED PROFICIENCY WILL BE DETERMINED BY HAVING THE

UNITS ACCOMPLISH ITS MISSION UNDER IED THREAT CONDITIONS DURING EXTERNAL AND INTERNAL EVALUATIONS TO STP STANDARDS (SEE STP 3-CIED-SM-TG).

3. USPACOM/USARPAC C-IED PROGRAM.

3.A(1) THE PRIMARY OBJECTIVE OF THE USPACOM C-IED STRATEGY IS TO PREVENT IEDS FROM BECOMING A WEAPON OF STRATEGIC INFLUENCE IN THE AOR. COMMANDER, USPACOM (CDRUSPACOM) HAS DESIGNATED USARPAC AS THE EXECUTIVE AGENT FOR DELIVERING C-IED TRAINING AND IRREGULAR WARFARE ANALYSIS PRODUCTS TO MITIGATE THE EVOLVING WORLDWIDE IED THREAT WITHIN PACOM AOR.

THE APCFC WILL DEVELOP STRATEGY, OPERATIONALIZE LINES OF EFFORT (LOE), AND EXECUTE OPERATIONS ICW COMPONENT AND SUB-UNIFIED COMMANDS. IN ADDITION, THE APCFC WILL REGULARLY SUBMIT C-IED GUIDANCE TO USPACOM J34 FOR INPUT TO THE ANNUAL USPACOM THEATER CAMPAIGN ORDER.

3.A(2) (A) THE EOD/C-IED PLANS AND OPERATIONS SECTION CONSISTS OF PERSONNEL WHO ASSIST THE USARPAC STAFF TO DEVELOP & EXERCISE EOD SUPPORT PLANS AND ESTABLISH EOD POLICY.

3.A(2) (B) THE IRW ANALYSIS SECTION CONSISTS OF PERSONNEL WHO DEVELOP AND MAINTAIN A THOROUGH UNDERSTANDING OF THE THREAT, TO INCLUDE NETWORK LEADERSHIP STRUCTURE, PLANNING PROCESSES, FINANCING AND MATERIAL PROCUREMENT, INFRASTRUCTURE, TECHNICAL SOPHISTICATION, TARGET SELECTION CRITERIA, RECRUITING METHODS, AND IED ATTACK TACTICS, TECHNIQUES AND PROCEDURES (TTPS). 3.A(2) (C) THE PARTNER NATION ENGAGEMENT SECTION SUPPORTS USPACOM COUNTRY OBJECTIVES, U.S. ARMY REGIONALLY ALIGNED FORCES (RAF) PROGRAM, AND USARPAC REGIONAL PARTNERSHIP PROGRAM WITH SYNCHRONIZED C-IED AND EOD PLANNING AND RESOURCES. USARPAC PLANNED AND UNIT LED C-IED AND EOD PARTNER NATION CAPABILITY DEVELOPMENT ENGAGEMENTS ARE FREQUENTLY THE FOOT IN THE DOOR THAT LEAD TO GREATER USARPAC ACCESS TO THESE NATIONS. SUCH ENGAGEMENTS PRODUCE MULTINATIONAL CONNECTIVE RELATIONSHIPS AND REGIONALLY NETWORKED COORDINATION OF ACTIONS WHICH DELIVER C-IED SOLUTIONS ACROSS MULTIPLE DOMAINS. 3.A(2) (D) THE TRAINING FACILITATION SECTION VALIDATES AND SUPPORTS UNIT HOME STATION TRAINING (HST) IN ACCORDANCE WITH U.S.ARMY 350-1 TRAINING REQUIREMENTS AND PROVIDES TRAINING RESOURCE SUPPORT, IED FABRICATION, CURRICULUM DEVELOPMENT, AND HOME STATION TRAINING TEAMS. THE HOME STATION TRAINING TEAMS PROVIDE UNITS WITH ORGANIC SUPPORT PERSONNEL TO INCLUDE C-IED TRAINING TEAMS (CTT) AND A READINESS AND VALIDATION MOBILE TRAINING TEAMS (RVMTT) WHO COLLABORATE WITH THE IRREGULAR WARFARE ANALYSIS SECTION IN SUPPORT OF THE ARMY C-IED STRATEGY TO ENSURE COMBATANT COMMANDERS (CCMD) RECEIVE RELEVANT C-IED TRAINING. THE APCFC PROVIDES COMMANDERS WITH A HOME STATION TRAINING CAPABILITY ON NON-STANDARD AND NON-PROGRAM OF RECORD C-IED SYSTEMS, THAT INFUSE LEADERS WITH EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES, INFORMATION, KNOWLEDGE AND PROFICIENCY TO OPERATE SUCCESSFULLY IN AN IED

THREAT ENVIRONMENT. IN ADDITION, THROUGH PURPOSEFULLY DESIGNED EXPERT ACADEMIC EXCHANGES (EAE) WITH PARTNER NATION FORCES, APCFC CTTS/RVMTT DIRECTLY COORDINATE AND SYNCHRONIZE THE EXECUTION AND FACILITATION IN THE DELIVERY OF C-IED TASKS ALONG ATTACK THE NETWORK (ATN), DEFEAT THE DEVICE (DTD), ADAPT THE FORCE (ATF) LINES OF EFFORT, VITAL TO THE SURVIVABILITY OF THE TOTAL FORCE. THE APCFC CTT'S AND RVMTT ARE THE ONLY ENDEMIC C-IED TRAINING CAPACITY WITHIN THE USPACOM CAPABLE OF PROVIDING THE REQUIRED INTELLIGENCE ENABLED C-IED TRAINING.

AS USARPAC'S C-IED HSTC, THE APCFC CTTS/RVMTT COLLABORATE WITH DEPLOYED FORCES, JOINT IED DEFEAT ORGANIZATION (JIEDDO), ASYMETRIC WARFARE GROUP (AWG), INSTALLATION MANAGEMENT COMMAND (IMCOM), PROGRAM EXECUTIVE OFFICE FOR SIMULATION, TRAINING AND INSTRUMENTATION (PEO-STRI), TRAINING AND DOCTRINE (TRADOC) AND OTHERS TO ENSURE THAT RAF UNITS RECEIVE CONSISTENT, HIGH-QUALITY C-IED TRAINING ON INDIVIDUAL AND COLLECTIVE TRAINING IN ALL OPERATIONAL ENVIRONMENTS WITHIN THE USPACOM AOR.

3.A(2) (D) (3) APCFC CTTS/RVMTT FOCUS IS TO INFUSE LEADERS WITH EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES, INFORMATION, KNOWLEDGE AND PROFICIENCY TO OPERATE IN AN IED THREAT ENVIRONMENT AND ENABLE INDIVIDUAL AND SMALL-UNIT C-IED COLLECTIVE TRAINING. CTTS/RVMTT PROVIDES LEADERS WITH INITIAL AND SUSTAINMENT TRAINING, AS WELL AS OVER-THE-SHOULDER COACHING, IN BOTH A GARRISON AND FIELD ENVIRONMENT TAILORED TO THE LOCAL COMMANDER(S) TRAINING OBJECTIVES. THE CTT/RVMTT SERVE AS A COMMANDERS SINGLE POINT OF ENTRY AND CLEARING HOUSE FOR ALL C-IED INITIATIVES AND ENABLERS, ADVISING ON ALL C-IED RESOURCES AVAILABLE FOR TRAINING, TO INTEGRATE, PLAN, SYNCHRONIZE, COORDINATE AND FACILITATE INNOVATIVE SOLUTIONS THROUGH THE USE OF LIVE, VIRTUAL, CONSTRUCTIVE AND GAMING C-IED ASSETS INTO A COMMANDERS SRM TRAINING CYCLE. THE CTT/RVMTTS ENABLE COMMANDERS TO INTEGRATE C-IED LEARNING INTO GARRISON AND FIELD TRAINING, AND SERVE AS THE TRAIN-THE-TRAINER FACILITATOR FOR LEADERS, ENHANCE THE COMMANDER(S) ABILITY TO MANAGE AND INTEGRATE TRAINING RESOURCES INTO HOME STATION TRAINING, PARTICULARLY FOR NON-STANDARD AND NON-PROGRAM OF RECORD (POR) SYSTEMS, AND FOR ALL UNIT TRAINERS, TRAINING MENTORS OR OBSERVER/CONTROLLERS.

8. SPECIALIZED C-IED FORCES. SPECIALIZED C-IED FORCES INCLUDE EOD, CEXC, EFL, WIT, AND COMBAT ENGINEER ROUTE CLEARANCE TEAMS. ALL SPECIALIZED C-IED UNITS ISO USPACOM MISSIONS SHOULD COORDINATE WITH USARPAC APCFC IOT SUCCESSFULLY UNDERSTAND RANGE RULES AND LIMITATIONS, USARPAC SPECIFIC SAFETY REGULATIONS AND REQUIREMENTS, HOST NATION (HN) AND PARTNER NATION (PN) POCs. ALL SPECIALIZED C-IED UNITS MUST BE PROFICIENT IN FORSCOM TRAINING REQUIREMENTS. FOR MORE DETAILS SEE ANNEX B, PARAGRAPH 10.D.

9. ENHANCE ALLIED AND PARTNER NATION C-IED CAPACITY BUILDING.

9.A. PURPOSE: IEDS ARE A GLOBAL THREAT. THE IED THREAT IS COMPLEX AND TRANSNATIONAL IN NATURE, REPRESENTING LAYERS OF INTERDEPENDENT, INTERCONNECTED GLOBAL NETWORKS AND SUPPORT SYSTEMS. THESE NETWORKS ADAPT RAPIDLY, COMMUNICATE QUICKLY, AND ARE UNCONSTRAINED BY POLITICAL BORDERS. A COLLABORATIVE EFFORT BETWEEN ALLIES AND PARTNER NATIONS SUPPORTED BY A WHOLE-OF-GOVERNMENT APPROACH IS ESSENTIAL TO NEUTRALIZING IED THREAT NETWORKS AND DEVICES.

9.B. APCFC PARTNER NATION INTEGRATION PROGRAM. USARPAC'S APCFC COORDINATES AND SUPPORTS EFFORTS TO CREATE OR ENHANCE RESPECTIVE PARTNER NATION'S ABILITY TO IDENTIFY, ENGAGE, AND DEFEAT IED NETWORKS IN THEIR RESPECTIVE COUNTRIES AND INTERNATIONALLY. APCFC PARTNER NATION INTEGRATOR (PNI) STAFF WORK WITH UNITS DEPLOYING WITHIN THE USPACOM AOR TO ENSURE USAPACOM AND USARPAC PN C-IED OBJECTIVES ARE INTEGRATED INTO OPERATIONS AND ENGAGEMENTS WITH ALLIES AND PARTNER NATIONS. UNITS WILL LEVERAGE APCFC PNI STAFF PRIOR TO ANY DEPLOYMENT IN USPACOM'S AOR TO ENSURE UNIT TRAINING EFFORTS ARE SYNCHRONIZED TO A SPECIFIC COUNTRY'S C-IED CAPABILITY AND CAPACITY. THIS WILL ENABLE UNITS WORKING WITH PARTNER NATIONS TO BUILD C-IED TRAINING PLANS THAT REMAIN ON TRACK AND PROVIDE THE UNIT WITH THE LATEST ASSESSMENT IN PROGRESS, CURRENT COUNTRY IED THREAT INTELLIGENCE, AND OTHER PERTINENT INFORMATION.

9.C(1) OVERALL PN C-IED CAPACITY BUILDING GOALS FOR TRAINING WITH OTHER NATIONS INCLUDE:

9.C(2) DEVELOP CAPACITY TO ENABLE SHARING OF C-IED INFORMATION.

9.C(3) BUILD PARTNER NATION C-IED INTEROPERABILITY TO SUPPORT AND ENABLE ALL C-IED LOES.

8.C(4) FOSTER REGIONAL COOPERATION AGAINST IED THREAT NETWORKS.

8.D. SHAPING THE OPERATING ENVIRONMENT (OE). WHEN SHAPING THE OE FOCUSED ON OUR PARTNERS AND ADVERSARIES, THE APCFC HAS THE ABILITY TO CONDUCT WHOLE OF GOVERNMENT C-IED ASSESSMENTS; ASSIST PN IN ESTABLISHING AND INSTITUTIONALIZING INTERNAL C-IED AND EOD TRAINING PROGRAMS; SUPPORT TRAINING WITH AND WHEN NECESSARY; INSTRUCT PARTNER NATION MILITARIES TO BUILD REGIONAL PARTNER C-IED CAPACITY IN VARIOUS TYPES OF MISSIONS FROM COMBAT AND COUNTER-INSURGENCY OPERATIONS TO PEACE-KEEPING OPERATIONS (PKO); DEVELOP US TRAINERS FOR EXECUTION/INCORPORATION OF C-IED TRAINING WITH PN; AND ADVISE DEPLOYING UNITS ON PN C-IED ABILITY LEVEL AND FOCUS AREAS, AND OF ANY IED THREATS WITHIN THAT PN.

8.E. ENDSTATE: AN ESTABLISHED BASIC C-IED TRAINING CAPABILITY WITHIN A PARTNER NATION THAT SHARES A COMMON LEXICON ENSURING US, ALLIED, AND PARTNER NATION PERSONNEL; CAN EFFECTIVELY COUNTER IED THREATS AND PARTNER NATION SERVICE MEMBERS ARE PREPARED TO OPERATE IN AN IED THREAT ENVIRONMENT IN ORDER TO MINIMIZE THE STRATEGIC, OPERATIONAL AND TACTICAL IMPACT OF IEDS. 10. ASSESSMENTS.

10.A. PURPOSE: SHARING FEEDBACK WITH STAKEHOLDERS ACROSS THE ARMY IS ESSENTIAL TO IMPROVING MISSIONS, PLANS, PROGRAMS AND POLICIES ASSOCIATED WITH REGIONALLY ALIGNED FORCES.

10.B. UNIT RECORD KEEPING. AFTER ACTION REVIEWS (AARS) ARE MANDATED BY ARMY REGULATION (AR) 11-33, ARMY LESSONS LEARNED PROGRAM, [HTTP://WWW.ARMY.MIL/USAPA/EPUBS/PDF/R11_33.PDF](http://www.army.mil/usapa/epubs/pdf/R11_33.pdf) WHICH REINFORCES BRIGADE-SIZED AND LARGER UNITS RESPONSIBILITY TO SUBMIT THEIR AARS TO THE TRADOC CENTER FOR ARMY LESSONS LEARNED (CALL) AND ESTABLISHES SUBMISSION PROCEDURES. BRIGADE (BDE), BATTALION (BN), COMPANY (CO), AND PLATOON (PLT) AARS MAY BE SUBMITTED AT ANY TIME DURING PRE-DEPLOYMENT, DEPLOYMENT, AND POST DEPLOYMENT. AARS AND LESSONS LEARNED AID THE ARMY IN ISSUE/TREND IDENTIFICATION/ANALYSIS AND DOCTRINE, ORGANIZATION, TRAINING, MATERIEL, LEADERSHIP AND EDUCATION, PERSONNEL, AND FACILITIES (DOTMLPF) SOLUTIONS TO FACILITATE FUTURE RAF OPERATIONS, ACTIVITIES, AND ENGAGEMENTS.

ASSESSMENT CRITERIA MAY INCLUDE IDENTIFYING RESOURCE/ CAPABILITY GAPS AND SHORTFALLS, RESPONSIVENESS, MISSION-TAILORED READINESS, COST, RELATIONSHIPS, CAPABILITIES, ACCESS, AND INTEROPERABILITY.
